- City of Athens Halloween/AUBA Trick or Treat, 10/26/2024, full uptown area

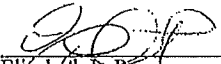

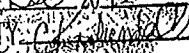

WHEREAS, the Court of Common Pleas offers to forfeit said property to the City of Athens, the political subdivision in which the property is located; and

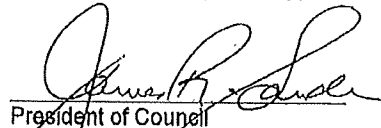

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATHENS, OHIO:

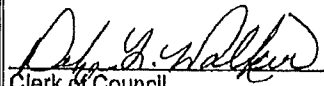
SECTION I: The Service-Safety Director is hereby authorized to acquire the legal rights to property located at 83 Columbus Road (former Buy Low), and is further authorized to petition the Court pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 5723.01(A)(3), for forfeiture to the City of Athens the described real estate, a copy of the plat is hereby attached and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION II: This Ordinance shall be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the City of Athens well fields and in order to meet acquisition deadlines, and that it shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

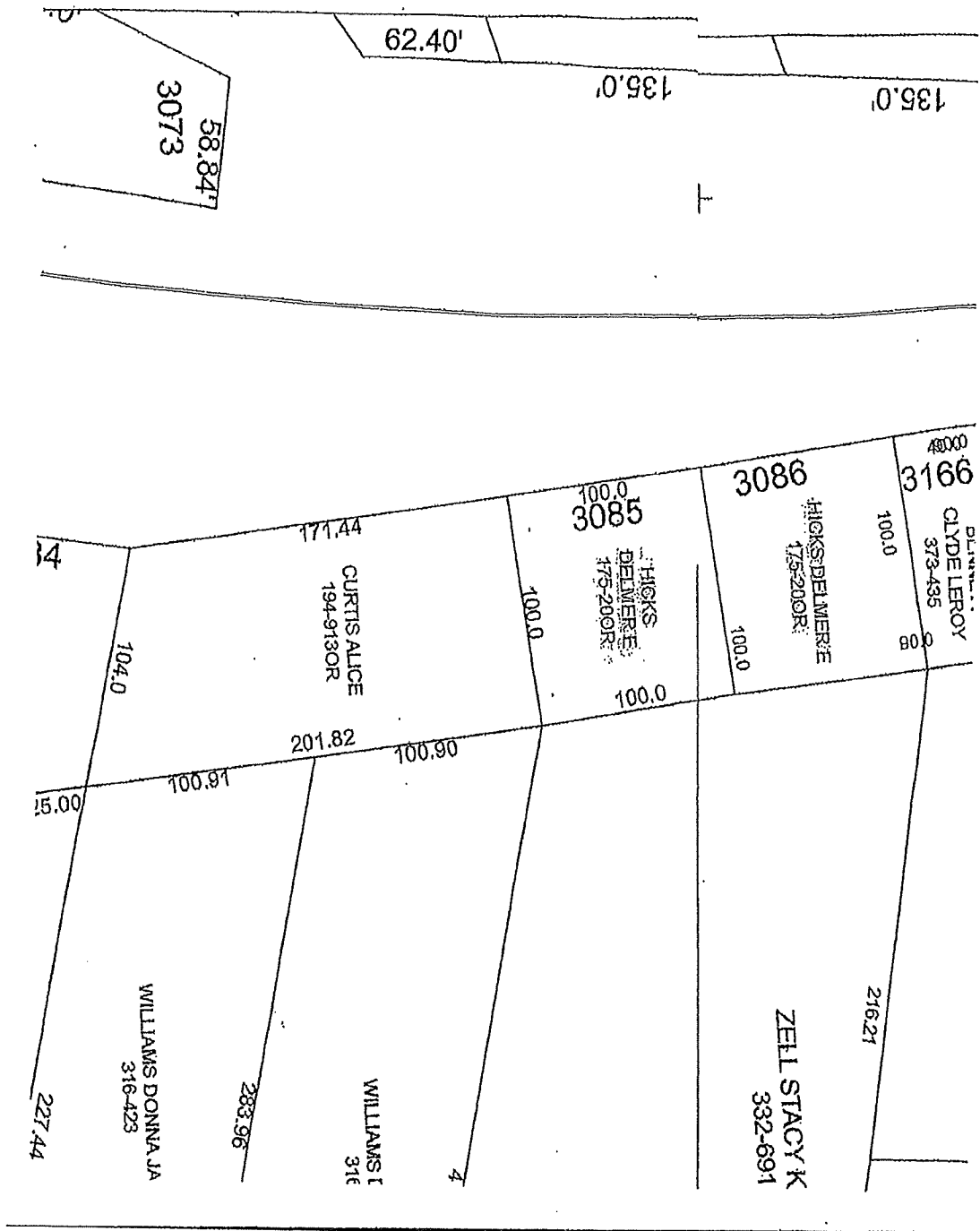

BIKE PATH EASEMENT

Athens County Public Libraries, a statutory school district free public library formed and operating under R.C. 3375.15 ("Grantor"), for valuable consideration received, hereby grants to the **City of Athens, Ohio** ("Grantee") a perpetual, non-exclusive easement over, across, and through the following described land of Grantor (the "Easement Area"):

See attached description and plat, incorporated herein by this reference.

Subject to easements, rights of way, reservations, restrictions, conditions, covenants, and leases of record.

Last Transfer: Volume 606, Page 464 and Volume 606, Page 468, Official Records of Athens County, Ohio.

This Bike Path Easement is given as a permanent easement to Grantee for the bike path permitted by the State of Ohio Easement between the State of Ohio and Grantee recorded in Volume 452, Page 1131, Official Records of Athens County, Ohio (the "Original Easement"), and is intended to encumber only so much of the real property described in the Original Easement as is now owned by Grantor pursuant to the instruments of Last Transfer referenced above.

Use of Premises. This easement shall be used solely to install, construct, reconstruct, use, operate, maintain, repair, replace, remove, service, and improve in, on over, under, across, through, and upon the Easement Area an asphalt Bike Path (the "Improvement").

Maintenance. If the surface of the ground in the Easement Area is disturbed at any time, Grantee shall provide necessary, fill, re-sod or re-seed any grassed areas, and make such repairs and replacement for a period of not later than one (1) year after the date of such disturbance as may be needed to restore the ground to its former condition or pay Grantor for all damages caused thereto. Grantee shall have the obligation at its cost to maintain and repair the Improvement on a continuous and ongoing basis, which maintenance and repairs shall be performed in a good and workmanlike manner to protect the safety and aesthetics of the Improvement.

Liability. Grantee shall protect, indemnify, and hold Grantor harmless, so far as permitted by Ohio law, from any claims, demands, causes, actions, and damages arising out of any act, omission, or neglect by Grantee or any of its successors, assigns, agents, servants, employees, contractors, subcontractors, and invitees ensuing from or in connection with Grantee's occupation and use of the Improvement or the Easement Area. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to be a waiver by Grantor of any legal or factual defenses which Grantor may enjoy.

Mechanic's Liens. Grantee shall not allow any liens or encumbrances to be filed against the Easement Area or Grantor's property, or any portion thereof. If such a lien or encumbrance is placed of record against the Easement Area or Grantor's property, or any portion thereof, Grantee shall, within thirty (30) days after receiving notice thereof, remove or discharge the same or bond off such lien or encumbrance.

Assignment. This Bike Path Easement may not be assigned or transferred, in whole in part, by Grantee without the prior consent of Grantor, which consent may be withheld for any reason. Should consent to any such assignment be granted, such assignment or transfer shall not relieve Grantee of its obligations and duties under the terms, covenants, and conditions of this Bike Path

Easement. Any assignee shall expressly assume, and by reason of such assignment or transfer shall be deemed as having assumed, all of the obligations and duties of Grantee hereunder.

The grant and other provisions of this easement shall constitute a covenant running with the land for the benefit of Grantee, its successors and assigns.

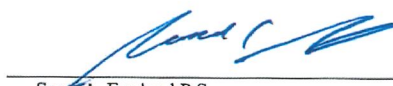

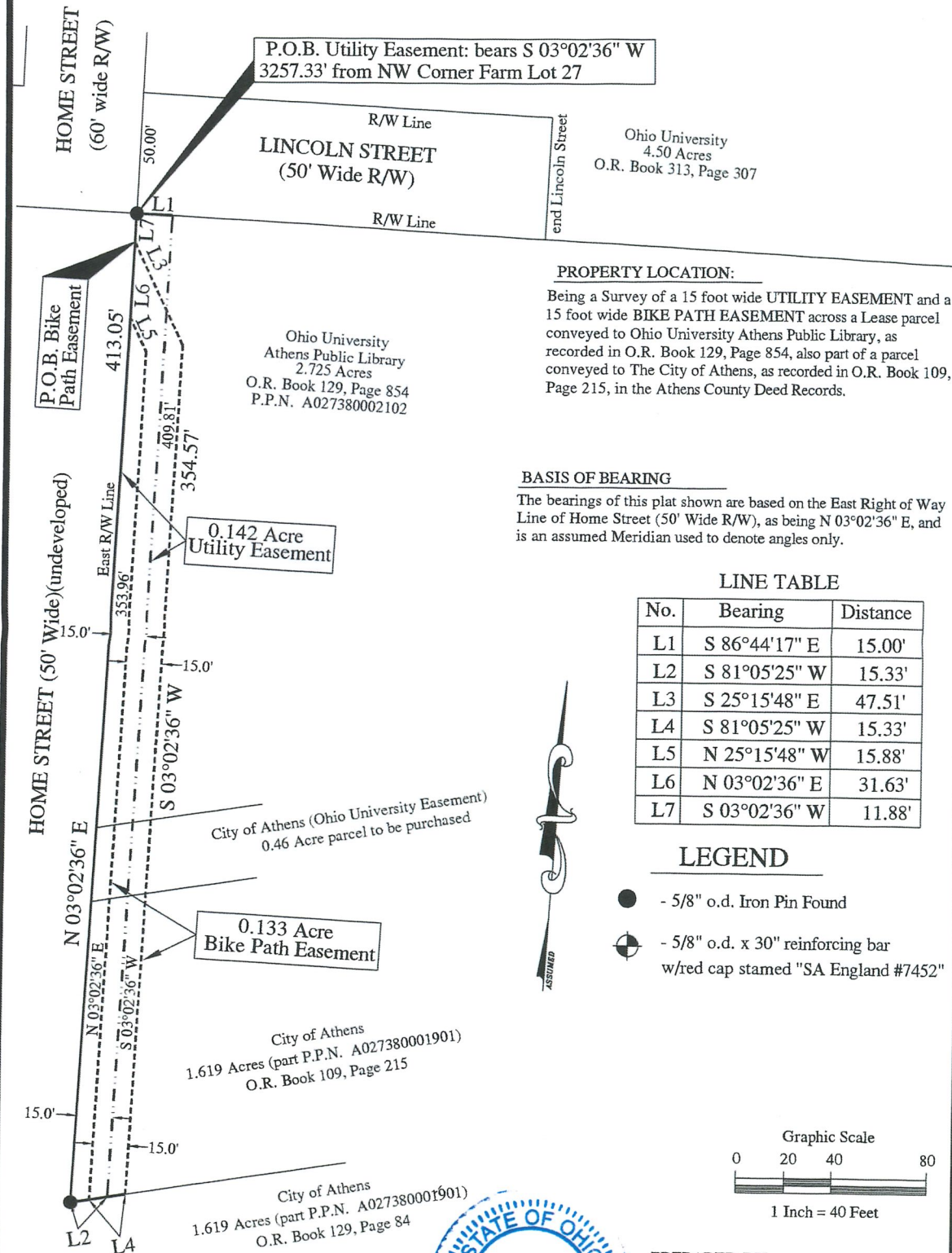

WHEREAS, Andrew Jackson Davison married Eliza Brown, a Virginia slave who self-emancipated in 1863 into the military encampment of General George Armstrong Custer, and was known for her brave and selfless actions during the Civil War, and after the war was employed as a housekeeper for the Custers; and

WHEREAS, Andrew and Eliza Davison lived in Athens at 159 Dean Street, now known as Washington Street; and

WHEREAS, Andrew Jackson and Eliza Brown Davison are significant citizens in the story of Athens, and representative of Athens' Black heritage;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATHENS, OHIO:

SECTION I: The unnamed right of way on Herrold Avenue is hereby approved to be named Davison Court, as described on the map attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION II: This Ordinance shall be in effect and full force upon passage and approval by the Mayor.

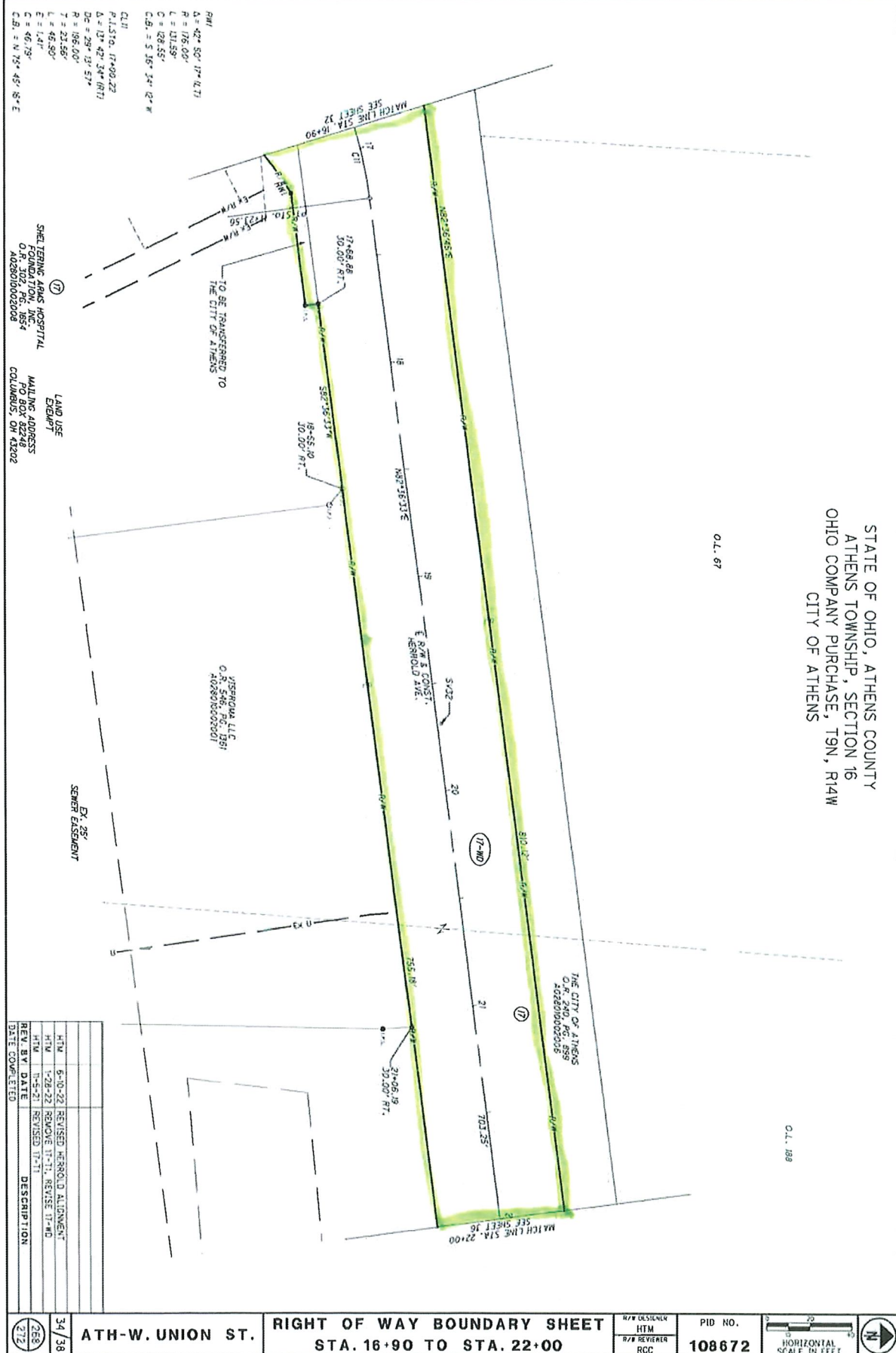

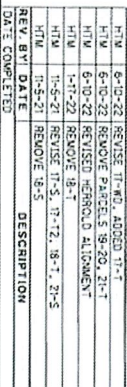

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 62-23; AUTHORIZING PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE STATE ROUTE 682/56 INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS, PROJECT (#357).

WHEREAS, a safety study was completed for this project (funded by ODOT);
and

WHEREAS, the City was awarded \$1,395,589 in ODOT Safety Program funds to construct a single lane roundabout; **and**

WHEREAS, the construction cost estimate after the completed Stage I design is approximately \$3.7 million; and

WHEREAS, the City Administration is directing the design firm to expand the project scope to include select improvements to SR682 north of the intersection to the city limits in support of traffic, and bike and pedestrian safety, additions that will increase the construction cost estimate; and

WHEREAS, the City Administration will implore ODOT to significantly increase the award of outside funding to address the various needs and higher costs;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATHENS, OHIO:

SECTION I: Sections II and III of Ordinance 62-23 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Section II: The 2023 Appropriation Ordinance 155-22 is hereby amended by appropriating from the unappropriated balance the sum of ~~Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00)~~ **Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750,000.00)** to Street Rehabilitation Fund, 572, T.C. 500, and increasing the total appropriations by said amount.

Section III: The Service-Safety Director is further authorized to expend up to ~~Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00)~~ **Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750,000.00)** from Street Rehabilitation Fund, 572, T.C. 500, for said Project (#357).

SECTION II: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ATHENS CITY CODE, TITLE 17, MUNICIPAL INCOME TAX, CHAPTER 17.01, [IN GENERAL], SECTIONS 17.01.011(B), AUTHORITY TO LEVY TAX, AND 17.01.012, PURPOSES OF TAX; RATE; AND CHAPTER 17.01.09, ANNUAL RETURN, SECTION 17.01.091(A)(1), RETURN AND PAYMENT OF TAX.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATHENS, OHIO;

SECTION I: Athens City Council hereby amends Athens City Code, Title 17, Municipal Income Tax, Chapter 17.01, [In General], Sections 17.01.011(B), Authority to Levy Tax, and 17.01.012, Purposes of Tax; Rate; and Chapter 17.01.09, Annual Return, Section 17.01.091(A)(1), Return and Payment of Tax, to read as follows:

Title 17, Municipal Income Tax, Chapter 17.01, In General, Section 17.01.012, Purposes of Tax; Rate.

Chapter 17.01. – [In General]

17.01.011. - Authority to levy tax.

(B) The ~~annual~~ tax is ~~levied at a uniform rate on all persons~~ an annual tax levied on the income of every person residing in or earning or receiving income in the City of Athens. and shall be measured by municipal taxable income. The City of Athens shall tax income at a uniform rate. The tax is levied on municipal taxable income, as defined herein.

(C) The tax is levied on income, qualifying wages, commissions and other compensation, and on net profits of business, professions or other activities earned on or after January 1, 2016. The prevailing income tax rate for the tax year being filed shall be levied, collected and paid with respect to: all prizes, awards and winnings of residents of the city derived from gaming, wagering, sweepstakes and games of chance; all prizes, awards and winnings of non-residents derived from gaming, wagering, sweepstakes and games of chance related to the winning of such income within the city; and all prizes, awards and winnings paid to residents of the city by the State Lottery Commission as hereinafter provided in this section of this chapter and other sections as they may apply.

17.01.012. - Purposes of tax; rate.

To provide funds for the purposes of general municipal operations, maintenance, new equipment, extension and enlargement of municipal services and facilities and capital

improvements of the City of Athens, there shall be, and is hereby levied a tax on salaries, wages, commissions and other compensation, and on net profits as hereinafter provided. Effective January 1, 2016, the tax shall be levied at a rate of 1.65 percent. Effective January 1, 2017, the tax shall be levied at a rate of 1.85 percent. Effective January 1, 2023, the tax shall be levied at a rate of 1.95 percent.

17.01.091. - Return and payment of tax.

(A)(1) An annual return with respect to the income tax levied on municipal taxable income by the City of Athens shall be completed and filed by every taxpayer for any taxable year for which the taxpayer is subject to the tax, subject to Divisions (A)(2) and (A)(3) of this section, regardless of whether or not income tax is due.

(2) (a) Any resident or nonresident taxpayer whose sole income subject to tax by the City of Athens is qualifying wages, and tax has been fully withheld on those wages, is exempt from filing an annual income tax return with the City of Athens.

(b) The tax administrator shall accept a return filed by an employer, agent of an employer, or other payer located in the City of Athens for all residents and nonresidents that meet the exemption in Division (2)(a).

(3) All resident individual taxpayers, 18 years of age and older, shall file an annual municipal income tax return with the City of Athens, regardless of income or liability, unless exempted under [Division] (A)(2) of this section.

SECTION II: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect at the earliest moment permitted by law upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2024 APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 130-23.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Constitution establishes the legislative, executive, and judicial branches of government; and,

WHEREAS, the judiciary is a separate and co-equal branch of government, with separate and distinct powers and responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 *Ohio Judicial Conference Budget Resource Handbook for Ohio Judges and Their Funding Authorities* stipulates that “case law states that Ohio courts have the inherent power to issue an order requiring the funding authority to pay for the reasonable and necessary expenses of operating the courts and that it may not impede a court’s business by refusing reasonable funding requests. The determination of what is a reasonable and necessary funding request rests solely with the court and the other branches of government may not substitute their judgment for that of the court. Requests for funding from courts are presumptively reasonable and valid. The funding authority may only refuse to fund a court’s request if the funding authority can demonstrate that the order constitutes an abuse of discretion and is unreasonable. Even if the court’s request would work a hardship or burden on other offices or agencies, the funding authority must comply with the order if the funding request is reasonable;” and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Supreme Court has held that the public interest is served when courts cooperate with their funding authorities, and despite the Athens Municipal Court’s increasing budget requests from the City of Athens General Fund; and despite significant concerns regarding the unappropriated balance in the General Fund, all concerned must be aware of the pressures and demands for general funds, and work cooperatively;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATHENS, OHIO:

SECTION I: The City Council finds the Court’s funding request to be reasonable and does hereby amend the 2024 Appropriation Ordinance 130-23 by appropriating from the unappropriated balance the sum of One Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$115,000.00), to General Fund, Municipal Court, 101.106, T.C. 100, and increasing the total appropriations by said amount.

SECTION II: The 2024 Appropriation Ordinance 130-23 is further amended by decreasing Diversion Fund, 232, T.C. 100, by Forty-Four Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$44,900.00), and decreasing DUI Court Fund, 237, T.C. 100, by Sixty-Six

Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$66,500.00), and decreasing the total appropriations by said amounts.

SECTION III: This Ordinance shall be in effect and full force upon passage and approval by the Mayor.
